## **Authentic Child Assessment: Monitoring Child Learning**

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Ongoing monitoring and analysis of child learning and progress in everyday activities is an important part of authentic assessment. This tool includes a series of questions that can be used to determine how well child learning activities are affecting child learning. Information for answering the questions can be gathered through observation of child participation in everyday activities, interviews with parents and other caregivers who know the child well, and work samples of a child's participation in the activities. The findings can be used to make decisions about how child learning activities should be modified or changed to maximize child learning in the activities.
